

INTRODUCTION

Air Force families across the world include 175,000 children ages 5-18 and these children generally move more than six to nine times during their K-12 school years, often making multiple moves in high school years alone. Academic standards, promotion/graduation requirements, services for children with special needs, eligibility for sports and extracurricular activities, and transfer and acceptance for records vary greatly from state to state, even district



to district. While these are not new issues, national emphasis on quality education and higher standards for admission to many post high school education and training institutions increase to stakes like never before.

VISION

SLO services are designed to address military child education issues of the Total Force, helping families to cope with normal reactions to stressors related to multiple relocations, deployments and the everyday challenges of military life.

- Provides for the delivery of special needs family support services in coordination with Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)

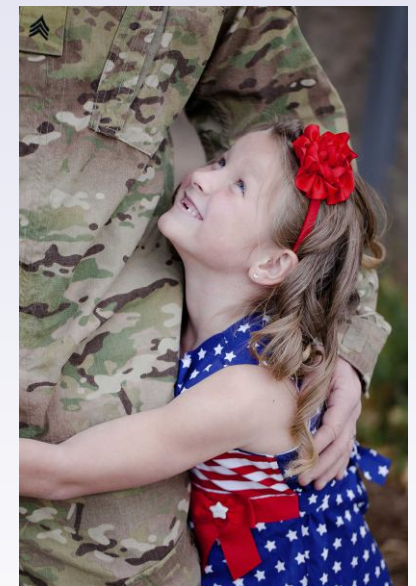
